HOMEWORK/STUDY POLICY

- All subjects' teachers should provide students with set of activities for homework daily
- Homework should be such that it is complete in 30 minutes/ subject [Year 9 – 10]
- Year 11 – 13 will have homework set for 45 minutes/ subject.
- Study session for Year 9 – 10 should be for 15 minutes/subject
- For Years 11 – 13 study session/ subject should not be less than 20 minutes
- Homework activity must have questions that should be a sign of the coverage of the days' lesson
- Homework given should be checked/discussed in the next class
- All students should have their homework completed and then move onto study / revision work
- Each child should spend at least 3 hours every day after school to complete assigned work and for study/revision.
- Day scholar parents must supervise child's study and ensure that the child's assigned work is completed

A Study Guide for Dudley High School Students

Rationale: Students should be taught on how to study. This is an attempt to give some scientific tips to students to help them study efficiently.

Follow these 12 steps to become efficient at learning.

Step 2: Set your 3 goals.

Goal 1: Long term goal


What do you want to be in future? Choose NOW. It is your long term goal.

Goal 2: Short term goal.

To achieve your goal 1, you have to pass FJC/FSLC/FSFE with high marks.

Now, passing FJC/FSLC/FSFE with high marks is your short -term goal.

Goal 3: Immediate goal.



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
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Step 11: Sufficient rest.

Six to six and a half hours of sleep per day is necessary and sufficient for efficient learning.

Step 12: Have self-confidence.

Believe that you can achieve your goals. Visualize your achieving the goal. At several times of the day, tell yourself I can become a (goal) and I will become a (goal). And, you will be what you want to be!
